1 MONDAY MORNING SESSION December 28, 2020 2 10:00 a.m. 3 4 PROCEEDINGS 5 6 BE IT REMEMBERED THAT, on the 28th day of 7 December, 2020, this cause came on for hearing before NED PETTUS JR., Safety Director. And, the 9 parties appearing in person and/or by counsel, as 10 hereinafter set forth, the following proceedings 11 were had: 12 13 SAFETY DIRECTOR PETTUS: This inquiry 14 involves the matter of Officer Adam Coy, No. 2275, 15 regarding IAB No. 202012-1029. 16 Today's date is December 28, 2020, 17 approximately 10:00 a.m. The location is the 18 Department of Public Safety, director's conference 19 room. 20 I am Safety Director Ned Pettus Jr. 21 And at this time, we will go around the 22 room and have each person identify yourself by name 23 and who you represent. 24 LIEUTENANT MYERS: Lieutenant Tim Myers,

9	SAFETY DIRECTOR PETTUS: Thank you.
10	Has Officer Coy received a copy of any
11	investigation report and/or charges and
12	specifications?
13	MR. FESTER: We have.
14	SAFETY DIRECTOR PETTUS: Okay. And at
15	this time, Lieutenant, you can read the charges and
16	specifications into the record, or Officer Coy's
17	representation can waive the reading of the charges
18	and specifications.
19	MR. DAVIS: We will waive, if you want
20	to.
21	LIEUTENANT MYERS: Yes, that's fine.
22	SAFETY DIRECTOR PETTUS: Okay. Then,
23	Lieutenant, if you would give an overview of the
24	facts and arguments, please.

1	LIEUTENANT MYERS: Good morning,
2	Director. This is Lieutenant Tim Myers with the
3	Division of Police.
4	The disciplinary matter before you today
5	involves Officer Adam Coy. Officer Coy has been
6	with the Division for 19 years and is assigned to
7	Zone 4, evening mid-watch patrol. Officer Coy has
8	been departmentally charged under Rule of
9	Conduct 1.04, Cause for Dismissal; and 1.19, Use of
10	Force.
11	The first thing I would like to do to
12	make sure we're all working off the same sheet of
13	music is to build a record here. So I'm going to be
14	introducing four exhibits. They have already been
15	provided to you, sir. And we have also already
16	provided copies to the FOP, mostly via e-mail
17	yesterday. And then also we have a hard copy here
18	today.
19	
20	And, thereupon, City Exhibit Nos. 1
21	through 4 were previously marked for purposes of
22	identification.
23	
24	LIEUTENANT MYER: The first exhibit,

1 which I premarked for identification as City 1, is 2 the administrative investigation completed by Chief 3 Quinlan and the supporting documents with that 4 investigation. 5 The second exhibit, City 2, is the 6 collection of memoranda that Chief Quinlan wrote to 7 your office in advance of this hearing, requesting -- notifying you of the internal 9 investigation and requesting expedited termination 10 in this case. 11 And then City Exhibit 3 is the notice of 12 departmental charges that were served to Officer 13 Coy. 14 And City Exhibit 4 are some personnel 15 documents from Officer Coy's personnel file, a 16 summary of his work history, and a summary of his 17 assignment history. Any questions, sir, about the exhibits? 18 19 SAFETY DIRECTOR PETTUS: 20 LIEUTENANT MYERS: Okay. 21 This is a sad day for the Division of 22 Police and the City of Columbus. A man is dead. 23 Columbus police officer is responsible. And unlike

the vast majority of other uses of deadly force by

24

our officers, the evidence at hand indicates that this killing was not objectively reasonable.

That being the case, it is our solemn today duty to seek termination for the officer responsible, Officer Adam Coy.

The full details of the circumstances related to these charges are contained in the investigative package before you. And pending your questions, I will let Chief Quinlan's investigation and the memoranda the Chief wrote to your office speak for themselves, although I'm happy to go into detail at any point if any party would like.

In summary, based on the known facts,

Officer Coy is accused of fatally shooting Mr. André

Hill, without legal justification. This is

aggravated by Officer Coy's failure to use trained

techniques to deescalate the situation and his

failure to render appropriate aid to Mr. Hill after

shooting him.

Moreover, Officer Coy did not activate his body-worn camera until after the shooting. This violated the Division of Police policy and deprived us of critical evidence in this case.

Section 10.8 of the FOP Collective

Bargaining Agreement provides that departmentally charged members are entitled to a hearing before the Chief of Police, only if the member is to be placed in a leave without pay status pending the Director of Public Safety hearing.

In this case, Officer Coy has not been placed in a leave without pay status pending this hearing. Though he has been relieved of his police authority, he has continued to receive full pay and benefits, pending your determination.

Accordingly, based on the facts and evidence personally known to and observed by Chief Quinlan, Chief Quinlan decided to forego a hearing at his level and sustain the Cause for Dismissal and Use of Force charge.

Section 10.9 of the FOP Collective
Bargaining Agreement requires that a member receive
written notice from the Chief of Police for all
charges and specifications against them prior to a
departmental hearing with the Public Safety
Director.

Officer Coy was served with a copy of the charges and specifications through his attorney on December 24, 2020.

Chief Quinlan took into account Officer Coy's work history, culpable mental state, and the nature and severity of the offenses against him prior to making his recommendation for discipline.

Chief Quinlan was cognizant of Section 10.3 of the Collective Bargaining Agreement, which requires most discipline to be progressive, except for the offenses that are of a critical nature.

Chief Quinlan was also mindful that misconduct that results from deliberate intention would indicate that a more severe penalty, up to the maximum penalty, may be imposed.

With those factors in mind, Chief Quinlan recommended a suspension of 240 working hours and termination for all charges and specifications.

I am confident that no Columbus Police
Officer wakes up intending to do unjustified
violence to our neighbors. But we cannot be judged
by our good intentions. We must be judged by our
actions. When the actions of one of our own falls
short, we have a responsibility to identify it,
address it, correct it, and prevent it.

With these considerations in mind, it is the position of the Chief of Police that Officer Coy

1	has no further value as a member of the Division of
2	Police and recommends his termination.
3	Pending any questions, that's all I have.
4	SAFETY DIRECTOR PETTUS: Okay.
5	Officer Coy's representation, you may
6	provide whatever information it is that you choose.
7	MR. DAVIS: Thank you, Director.
8	We would note for the record that a
9	continuance was requested due to Officer Coy's
10	counsel being on vacation. And this notice was
11	served after 5:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve, for a
12	hearing scheduled the following Monday morning.
13	We would also note, due to the
14	unavailability of counsel, we are preserving all
15	contractual and just-cause arguments in this matter.
16	We would also note that this was not a
17	Priority 1 or 2 run, and that the body-worn camera
18	policy cannot be applied retroactively.
19	Thank you.
20	SAFETY DIRECTOR PETTUS: Okay.
21	Lieutenant Myers, do you have any
22	rebuttal?
23	
	LIEUTENANT MYERS: Nothing, sir.

1	If there is nothing further, I will take
2	everything into consideration that has been provided
3	to me and presented here today, and you will be
4	notified of my decision.
5	LIEUTENANT MYER: Thank you, Director.
6	MR. DAVIS: Thank you.
7	SAFETY DIRECTOR PETTUS: Thank you.
8	
9	And, thereupon, the hearing was
10	concluded at approximately 10:12 a.m.
