 - Adding 33 additional school counselors
 - Adding Literacy Specialists in ALL schools PreK-12
 - Adding Bilingual Liaisons in ALL regions
 - Focusing on Improving Attendance
 - Increasing Services to Homeless and Vulnerable Students



Two "5 Big Themes" Analysis

- Stakeholders Mail Box
- Digital Academy Staff Feedback

- Full-time teacher support 5 days a week
- Teacher availability during school hours
- Flexible scheduling options for families
- A better balance between synchronous and asynchronous time for elementary students w/choices for delivery (reduce screen time)
- In person testing, orientation, help sessions and extended learning opportunities

BlendED Information



- Think of BlendED as a "School Without Walls."
- Open Enrollment from May 17-28, 2021.
 - 2,000 students maximum
 - Students will enroll for the year
 - Follow all current CCS protocols for Open Enrollment
- The BlendED model is allowable by the Ohio Department of Education (ODE).





Latchkey

Latchkey



- All 21 latchkey locations will be open.
- Hours and days of operation will return to Pre-COVID schedule.
- Enrollment and payments will be processed digitally at all locations.





Technology

Technology



- All students will have access to a computing device that can be used in the classroom and outside the school buildings.
- Established, consistent process for technology repairs and replacement.

Technology



- Conquering the Digital Divide Availability of Internet access for our students in buildings and from home
 - Wireless access points have been added to all classrooms in the district school buildings to ensure coverage for increased use of technology in a blended setting.
 - Multiple methodologies for providing access from home hotspots, Franklin County Digital Coalition
- Safe and secure learning environment on student Chromebooks.

Summer Training

- Coaches will work with the school athletic director and principal to plan summer activities for preparation for the Fall sports season.
- Coaches will submit plans for summer activities to the AD.
 - All plans must be in compliance with all health and safety regulations.
- Coaches will continue to follow all protocols that are in currently in place.

Fall Sports

- CCS plans to provide a full fall season of interscholastic athletics.
 - Full schedules will be available for teams to compete.
 - Schedules for the fall season have already been provided to coaches.
- CCS teams will follow all protocols in place to ensure that student athletes are able to participate to the fullest extent.





Non-Sport Extracurricular Activities

Non-sport Extra-Curricular Activities



- Following music and arts safety guidelines.
- All non-sport extracurricular activities will resume.
- Continue to follow arts-specific health and safety protocols.
- Activities will include live spectators as recommended by CDC guidelines.

Safety & Security

Safety and Security



- Hire, train, and assign 20 additional safety and security personnel.
- Revise/update Emergency Operations Plan procedures and Safety Plans.
- Install additional building access control devices, cameras, and other physical security measures.
- Improve emergency communication systems in schools (radios, repeater repairs/upgrades, and software solutions).
- Collaborate with Franklin University, ODE, and other community partners on Professional Development training plan for safety and security staff for SY22.
